Faculty Lecturer 2009/10

Description:

Each year the Faculty Senate Council honors one of our DVC Faculty by selecting a Faculty Lecturer. Historically we have an extensive list of distinguished faculty that were chosen to present a lecture to our college community. The Faculty Lecturer will be awarded \$1,000 from the Faculty Senate Voluntary Fund for presenting his/her lecture. The lecture will be presented in April 2010 to the college community once during the day and once in the evening.

Criteria for Selection:

Full-time and part-time DVC Faculty may be nominated. The Faculty Senate Council seeks an individual who has made a professional contribution to the college to present a lecture topic of wide, general interest to our college community.

Application Process:

Each nominee will provide a brief written summary of the lecture topic he or she proposes to present. The Senate Honors Committee will forward a recommendation to the Faculty Senate Council for approval. **Send nominations along with their descriptive summary to the Faculty Senate Office no later than Thursday, December 3, 2009.** The Faculty Senate Council will select the Faculty Lecturer this fall semester.
